Dog Eligibility

Fast CAT events are open to all dogs at least 12 months of age. Spayed or neutered dogs and/or dogs with breed disqualifications may be entered. **Females in-season may not participate.** Refunds will be given for lameness, unfitness, or in-season females.

AKC Registration is Required

All dogs must be individually registered with the AKC. This includes all AKC registered purebreds, Foundation Stock Service (FSS), Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL), and AKC Canine Partners. Dogs must be spayed or neutered to qualify for a Canine Partners number.

Not AKC registered yet? NO PROBLEM! See the next section – Canine Partner Enrollment!

Canine Partners Enrollment

If your dog is not registered with AKC, you may enroll through the Canine Partners.

Entries

Entry Method: First received.

Online Entries Preferred: Online entries will be accepted upon opening day and time of test opening for Online Entries Visit: <https://form.iotform.com/251884146478166>

By Mail: Complete an official AKC entry form for each dog. ONE ENTRY FORM PER DOG. Multiple tests may be selected for the same dog on one entry form. Dogs may enter only once per competition test. Multiple entry forms for multiple dogs (maximum 10 entry forms) may be mailed together and paid with one check. Mail completed form(s) with fees payable to: **K-9 STAC of South Dakota**- 5100 143rd Ave, Rapid City, SD 57701

Day of Test Entries: Day of test entries may be available based on space. Entry fee per run is \$30. Register online, or complete paper entry at the Secretary table. Cash and Credit accepted. There will be a \$1.50 credit card fee assessed. **NOTE: All dogs must be registered and ready to run no later than 3:30pm on Friday and Saturday and 3:00pm on Sunday.**

Withdrawing Entries: No entry fees shall be refunded if a dog is absent. Also, no entries will be refunded if a dog is disqualified, excused, or banned from competition by the test committee. Any entries pulled prior to pre-entry closing date must be made via email or mail. Entries are unable to be refunded post-closing date.

FUN RUNS: Fun runs may be available time permitting. Fun runs will be on a first come, first served basis subject to time availability. Competition runs may take precedence.

Run of Day – Roll Call, Inspection, Running Times/Ribbons

Roll Call/Check In will start at 8:30 on Saturday and 7:30 on Sunday, unless the committee and secretary are set up and ready to start taking dogs earlier, in which case dogs may run up to 30 minutes prior to published start time. We will be holding a flexible roll call. There is no guarantee that you can run if you are not checked in by 4:30pm on Saturday and 3:30pm on Sunday. You will check in at the secretary table and will be given your card(s) for the day. You must check in each day. [Worker dogs may run early and may also jump the line.](#)

Inspections: Dogs must be inspected for lameness, fitness, and for females in-season **before EACH run**. ***This includes checking for females in season – EVEN if your female has been spayed.*** [This is an AKC rule.](#) Measurements, as needed, are also completed at this time. **Note:** Make sure to bring your card for the run, this is how the gate steward will know that your dog has passed inspection and is ready to run!

Getting on the Board to Run: Bring your card, your dog, two leashes and yourself plus one person (it takes two people to run a dog - a releaser and catcher) to the gate steward. They will take your card and put you on the board. Please ensure there is PLENTY of space between your dog and other dogs. If you don't have a releaser or catcher, we can help. **Please let the gate steward know you need help.** We will also have a few extra leashes, please remember to return them so others can also have the benefit of their use.

NOTE: [Worker dogs take precedence.](#)

Running your dog: It is recommended that a slip-lead be used and that the dog runs without a collar. Dogs may wear any collar **except a choke collar, a collar with prongs, or an electronic training collar**. The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of the collar getting hung up on something during the run. Note: Owners may be asked to secure tags to the collar if the inspection committee is concerned they may get hung up during the run. Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog's hair. Wrapping of legs is allowed but must be removed prior to each inspection. [The owner assumes all responsibility for the safety of the dog regarding the dog's collar and paraphernalia on the dog.](#)

Post Run & Times: If you have more than one run, return to the inspection area for re-inspection for lameness, fitness, and in-season females. Remember to bring your card. If you have completed your runs for the day, return to the secretary's table for your time and ribbon(s). Stickers for ribbons will be provided, it may take up to 20 minutes post run for your sticker to be ready for you.

Awards

Qualifying Runs: All dogs who receive a qualifying score will receive a flat light blue ribbon for each competition run. Note: Fun Runs are not competition runs therefore will not receive an official ribbon but will receive their time.

New Title Rosette Ribbons will be offered for all dogs earning their BCAT, DCAT, FCAT/FCAT#

Personal Best Ribbons: K-9 STAC of South Dakota will be offering a Personal Best Ribbon – [ONE per weekend.](#)

Notice to all Exhibitors

Huntmaster: The Huntmaster is responsible for field safety and therefore they are in COMPLETE charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this responsibility, they have the authority to have the lure stopped if needed and signal the handler to retrieve their dog. All event participants and spectators MUST follow ALL instructions from the Huntmaster promptly and swiftly. The Huntmaster also ensures the lure is positioned correctly, the lure operator and timers are ready, and shall give the "Tallyho" verbal signal to release the dog.

Weather: This is a rain, snow, or shine event. In the case of extreme weather, the club and its committee may delay or cancel the event. If the club makes the determination to cancel the event, they will also determine whether they will refund entry fees. Please ensure you and your dog's comfort by bringing portable shade, shelter, water, etc. Credit card processing fees will not be refunded.

Food: Bring your own lunch and snacks and water for your dogs.. A food vendor will not be available onsite. Several restaurants are within a couple miles of the facility.

Restrooms: A port-a-potty will be available for use.

Timers: The latest model Arena Gear break-beam timers will be utilized. A second set of Arena Gear timers will be available upon device failure, as well as, stop watches as last resort.

Hotels/RV Camping: See Below

Substitution of dogs will be accepted up to the time of inspection. Once inspection is complete, no further substitution will be allowable.

Liability: The event-hosting club, the event secretary, its agents, members, representatives, volunteers, etc., assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children or spectators. A waiver must be signed by every individual as they enter the facility where they will be given a wristband.

Ineligible Entries: Incomplete, unsigned, unpaid, late, conditional entries, or entries not containing the "Agreement" found on the Official AKC Entry Form will not be accepted. Electronic signature will be accepted.

Returned check fee of \$50 will be assessed for any check(s) returned for insufficient funds and must be paid via cash or with credit card prior to running in addition to the entry fees.

Media: All rights to televise, videotape, advertise, photograph, promote or otherwise exploit this event are vested in the club, or in persons to whom assignments of such rights have been made in writing by the club. All persons and animals attending these shows grant the club the right to use their likeness and voice in any matter without further consent.

Conduct: Persons exhibiting conduct detrimental to AKC /the Club/any dogs(s) and/or other person(s) will be asked to leave the test site.

Loose and uncatchable dogs: If your dog gets loose when it is not competing or if the dog is causing an excessive delay of the event because it refuses to be caught by the catcher you may be assessed a \$5 fine. Dogs that delay the event because their owners cannot retrieve them quickly from the course may be refused entry at future events.

Veterinarian Advice: Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to ensure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites or infectious diseases and have appropriate vaccinations. Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are overweight or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The Inspection Committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test, and in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded.

In-season females: In-season females known to be in-season are not allowed onsite.

Fast CAT Summary Description

The Fast CAT Test is a timed 100-yard dash for dogs. It is meant to be a fun and healthy activity of interest to any dog owner. The following is a summary of how the event is structured.

How does Fast CAT Work?

1. Fast CAT is a timed straight race of 100 yards.
2. Dogs run singularly.
3. The dog's time to complete the 100-yard dash is converted into MPHs. The calculation to convert to MPH is as follows: $204.545 \div \text{dog's time} \times \text{handicap} = \text{POINTS}$.
4. A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers.
 - 18" or greater = handicap is 1.0
 - 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5
 - Below 12" = handicap is 2.0
5. $\text{Points} = \text{MPH} \times \text{dog's handicap}$
6. Fast CAT titles suffix titles are earned at designated milestones:
 - BCAT = 150 points
 - DCAT = 500 points
 - FCAT = 1,000 points
 - FCAT# = every additional 500 points
7. Top 20 by Breed by Year: The AKC Fast CAT website will feature the Top 20 Fastest Dogs by Breed by Year national standings. The standings will be updated as event results are processed.
8. Eligibility to participate: Open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered/listed with the AKC. This includes dogs recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers, or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Females in-season may not enter. A dog may enter only once per event (An event number defines the event.)
9. An inspection committee shall inspect each entry for lameness, fitness to compete, and females in-season. The inspection committee is responsible for measuring the height at the withers if necessary.

10. Safety: Safety is of utmost importance. The event committee is responsible for ensuring the safety of the course, the equipment, and the conduct of those involved in the event. It is recommended that the event committee run a test dog before the start of the event to ensure that the equipment functions correctly and that all personnel understand their jobs.
11. The Start: Dogs may start up to 10 feet behind the starting line. There will be a line on the ground indicating the 10-foot mark. Both front paws must be forward of the release line.
12. The Finish: The club must provide enough room for a safe run-out area. It is required that this be a minimum of 30 yards, however, this is up to the club's decision, given the specifics of the setting. The club should consider fencing at the end of the course to help collect the dogs. It is recommended that an owner or someone familiar with the dog stand at the finish to catch the dog once the course has been completed.
13. Timing Devices: The time to complete the 100-yard dash is recorded to the nearest 1/100th of a second (i.e. 9.11) The club will use break the beam equipment to obtain the time. If the timers fail, stopwatches will be used, and two timers will be positioned at the finish line. An individual at the start line shall signal with an arm drop the moment the nose of the dog crosses the start line. The timers shall start their stopwatches at the start of the arm drop. The timers shall stop their watches when the nose of the dog crosses the finish line. The times from the two stopwatches shall be averaged to determine the recorded time.
14. Lure Equipment: The event will be run with a reversible, variable speed, continuous loop system. The lure operator and the lure equipment shall be safely positioned in a manner that does not interfere with retrieving the dogs at the end of the course.
15. Lure: A white plastic bag will be used for the lure.
16. Course/Fencing: The course is essentially flat, on grass, and the course area is fenced with 4' white rope fencing
17. The Hunt Master has control of the course. In summary, the Hunt Master is in charge of all dogs and handlers on the field, shall ensure handlers understand safe release and retrieval procedures, shall provide the lure is positioned correctly, shall ensure the lure operator, timers, and starting line signal person are ready, shall signal the lure operator to start the lure and shall give the verbal signal "tallyho" to release the dog.
